REQUEST UNDER THE FREEDOM OF INFORMATION ACT 2000 Ref No: FOI2018/03442

I write in connection with your request for information received on 25th June. I note you seek access to the following information:

I would like to request the following information about your force for each of the last three years.

- 1) How many arrests for child sex offences has your force made using, at least in part, evidence gathered by so-called paedophile hunter/vigilante groups?**
- 2) How many individuals arrested for child sex offences are known to have taken their own lives following their arrest?**
- 3) How many individuals arrested for child sex offences, following evidence gathered by so-called paedophile hunter/vigilante groups are known to have taken their own lives following their arrest?**

I am required by the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (The Act) to handle all requests in a manner that is blind to the identity of the requestor. Any information released in response to a request is regarded as being published and therefore, in the public domain without caveat.

Following enquiries within the Constabulary please see our response below.

Response – Any information received via a telephone call to the Force Contact Centre would be recorded in our Incident Management System. Over the last five years there were over 1,500 logged records which included the words Paedophile, Pedophile or Paedo, the details of these entries would have to be read individually to ensure that the information related to such groups.

Unfortunately this means it is not possible to suggest a way to refine this request, as even if the date range were reduced it would still require hundreds of records to be manually checked.

We therefore, consider that the cost of complying with your request for information would exceed the appropriate limit of £450 as has been stated in the Freedom of Information (Fees & Appropriate Limit) Regulations 2004.

Section 12(1) of the Freedom of Information Act 2000 provides that –
“Section 1(1) does not oblige a public authority to comply with a request for information if the authority estimates that the cost of complying with the request would exceed the appropriate limit.”

The numerical data presented in this response is an un-audited snapshot of un-published data sourced from "live" systems and is subject to the interpretation of the original request by the individual extracting the data.
