I write in connection with your request for information received on 3rd May. I note you seek access to the following information:

Under the Freedom of Information Act I would like to request all information that you have for the past 7 years regarding problems with the playing fields/tennis court in Studlands Rise, either reported to the Police or the local council. If a fee is required from myself please let me know and I will arrange payment immediately.

Today a sign was erected on the tennis court in Studlands Rise, could you advise why this sign has been erected?

You fail to put up an anti-social board since the last one was stolen last year, yet in my opinion you are now encouraging anti social behaviour especially with the picture of a football on the sign, this is personally targeting me and making it impossible for me to live here with this continued anti social behaviour.

I am required by the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (The Act) to handle all requests in a manner that is blind to the identity of the requestor. Any information released in response to a request is regarded as being published and therefore, in the public domain without caveat.

Following enquiries within the Constabulary please see our response below.

Response – Please see the below table detailing all incidents that have occurred in Studlands Rise, Royston in the past 7 years;

2011	DOG WAS ATTACKED BY ANOTHER DOG AND HAD ITS HEAD IN THE OTHER DOGS MOUTH. THE DOG ALSO INJURED ITS OWNER WHO HAD TO GO TO HOSPITAL. IT HAPPENED AT STUDLAND RISE PARK, ROYSTON.

Please note the above information relates to calls received by the police resulting in the creation of an incident login the command and control system. The logs identified have been done so by identifying the road Studlands Rise, either as the location or if mentioned in the free text of the log.

Logs mentioning the incidents in the car park or the road have been excluded (as this was not requested), police generated reports regarding operational activity have also been excluded.

It may not always be possible to identify the exact location of incidents reported from the summary of the log. The data supplied can only be used as a basic estimate as the information recorded may not be the exact location.

For the period 01/05/2011 to 30/04/2018 there were 20 logs identified. Please note, some logs may be a report the same incident more than once.

The numerical data presented in this response is an un-audited snapshot of un-published data sourced from "live" systems and is subject to the interpretation of the original request by the individual extracting the data.
