REQUEST UNDER THE FREEDOM OF INFORMATION ACT 2000 Ref No: FOI2018/04595

I write in connection with your request for information received on 16th August. I note you seek access to the following information:

For each of the past 10 years (2007 – 2017), within the Hertfordshire Constabulary region:

- 1. How many road traffic incidents were recorded in which a cyclist was killed in a collision involving a motor vehicle?**
- 2. Of those incidents, how many resulted in the driver being charged with any “causing death by” driving offence?**
- 3. Of those drivers charged, how many were convicted of a “causing death by” driving offence?**
- 4. Of those drivers convicted, how many received:**
 - a. An immediate prison sentence;**
 - b. A suspended prison sentence?**
- 5. For those drivers who received a prison sentence, immediate or suspended, what was the average length of the sentence imposed.**
- 6. Of those drivers convicted, how many were disqualified from driving?**
- 7. Of those who received a disqualification, how many received a disqualification of one year or less.**

I am required by the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (The Act) to handle all requests in a manner that is blind to the identity of the requestor. Any information released in response to a request is regarded as being published and therefore, in the public domain without caveat.

Following enquiries within the Constabulary please see our response below.

Response - The information you have requested is not centrally recorded. In order to carry out this request we would be required to manually check each individual collision that occurred within Hertfordshire between 2007 and 2017.

Unfortunately this means it is not possible to suggest a way to refine this request, as even if the date range were reduced it would still require hundreds of records to be manually checked.

We therefore, consider that the cost of complying with your request for information would exceed the appropriate limit of £450 as has been stated in the Freedom of Information (Fees & Appropriate Limit) Regulations 2004.

Section 12(1) of the Freedom of Information Act 2000 provides that –
“Section 1(1) does not oblige a public authority to comply with a request for information if the authority estimates that the cost of complying with the request would exceed the appropriate limit.”

Section 17(5) of the Freedom of Information Act 2000 requires Hertfordshire Constabulary, when refusing to provide such information (because the cost of compliance exceeds the appropriate limit) to provide you the applicant with a notice which states that fact.

In accordance with the Freedom of Information Act 2000 this letter acts as a Refusal Notice under Section 12 of the Freedom of Information Act.
